# Booth Students Create Jaid, an AI-Driven Investment Newsletter with Sentiment Analysis Wall Street Journal, March 13, 2025

Professor Bradford Levy was excited to see the impact of the latest quarterly earnings season on his portfolio, but he wasn't sure if he'd be able to dedicate enough time to checking the new about all of his positions given his commitments to his research and teaching his very curious students in his AI and Financial Information course. Fortunately, he was part of a beta test for Jaid, an AI-powered investment research tool that linked directly to his portfolio and provided him with daily newsletters in his inbox. These digests were curated with the most important financial news and sentiment analysis to help him quickly gauge the market impact of recent developments.

"Jaid was not only a real time-saver, but it also helped inform me as an investor," Levy stated. "I research my portfolio diligently when I have the time, but Jaid helps me find important news that I might not have otherwise seen. I like that it gives me a quick sentiment analysis for each article so that I can see what the initial market reaction is, which helps guide my thinking when I re-evaluate my investment decisions."

As he checked his latest digest from Jaid, he noticed an alert summarizing recent tariff expectations from policymakers, highlighting a negative sentiment score for companies with global supply chains. Within seconds, he had a snapshot of how potential policy shifts might affect his holdings.

Retail investors often struggle to filter through the overwhelming amount of market news. Professional traders have Bloomberg Terminals and teams of analysts, but individual investors lack an efficient way to track news that matters to their portfolio. Jaid solves this by analyzing an investor's portfolio to identify relevant stocks, researching and curating the most important news for those positions, using AI to process news sentiment and categorize articles as positive, negative, or neutral, and delivering a personalized investment newsletter directly to users' inboxes.

"Jaid takes the guesswork out of financial news," said co-founder Nikhil Kishore. "Instead of sifting through hundreds of articles, our platform shows you exactly what's most relevant to your investments, with clear sentiment scores to help you interpret the impact."

Jaid operates in four key steps. First, it takes in a user's portfolio positions to determine which stocks are most relevant. Second, it researches and curates the most impactful news stories related to those positions, filtering out lower-priority articles. Third, it applies sentiment analysis to classify each article as positive, negative, or neutral. Finally, it compiles these insights into a personalized newsletter that gives investors a clear summary of their portfolio's most important news each day.

Unlike Google Alerts, which surfaces articles based on broad keyword matches, or Seeking Alpha, which relies on user-generated content, Jaid actively scores, ranks, and filters news using an importance engine trained on historical market reactions. Jaid's AI isn't just summarizing—it's prioritizing what actually moves markets based on sentiment strength and relevance to your portfolio.

Jaid helps to save investors time, which is especially important as a study from Empower found that the average retail investor spends just 12 minutes a day looking through portfolios. Other solutions can't provide the quick, personalized, insightful picture that Jaid can, which is exactly what retail investors have been looking for.

"Retail investors shouldn't have to spend hours sorting through financial news to stay informed," said co-founder Mark Khoury. "With Jaid, they get the insights they need in minutes."

Jaid is currently in beta testing with a group of early adopters and is expected to launch publicly in Q3 2025. The platform will operate on a freemium model, offering a free tier with daily newsletters that include top news and sentiment scores, and a premium tier with advanced filtering, historical sentiment tracking, and additional AI-powered insights.

The team is actively refining the importance engine and collecting user feedback to improve the ranking of news articles.

"Our goal is to build a tool that retail investors truly rely on," said co-founder Hamiyyet Bilgi. "We are already seeing strong engagement from beta users, and we're excited to expand access later this year."

#### **Frequently Asked Questions:**

#### **General Questions**

#### 1. Who is Jaid for? Who is the target customer?

Jaid is designed for retail investors who want to stay informed about market-moving news without spending hours searching for and analyzing financial articles. This includes long-term investors who want to monitor their portfolios without being overwhelmed, active traders who need real-time updates on sentiment shifts, and multi-asset investors who hold stocks, ETFs, bonds, and cryptocurrencies. The retail investment space is growing rapidly, with over 31% of American adults using online retail brokerage programs, and over 30 million new retail investors have created brokerage accounts in the US since 2020. The total addressable market (TAM) for investment research and financial news platforms is estimated to be over \$6 billion, covering AI-driven financial analysis, premium news subscriptions, and brokerage-integrated research tools. While trading platforms like Robinhood and E\*TRADE have simplified investing, they do not provide AI-driven, personalized financial news tailored to individual portfolios. Jaid fills this gap by offering a highly efficient research tool that distills vast amounts of financial news into personalized, actionable insights, making it easier for investors to make informed decisions.

#### 2. Why should I use Jaid instead of reading financial news on my own?

Financial news is scattered across multiple platforms, making it difficult for retail investors to keep up with the latest developments relevant to their investments. Investors often spend hours manually filtering through news articles, market reports, and earnings updates to find information that directly impacts their holdings. Institutional investors have access to Bloomberg Terminals, dedicated research teams, and AI-powered analytics, while individual investors are left relying on fragmented sources or keyword-based alerts that lack contextual insights. Jaid

solves this by automating news aggregation, filtering out irrelevant stories, and ranking the most impactful articles based on relevance and sentiment. This allows investors to focus on what truly matters to their portfolios without wasting time sorting through endless headlines.

#### **Functionality & Features**

#### 3. How does Jaid work?

Jaid operates in four key steps:

- 1. **Portfolio Analysis:** Users input their portfolio manually or connect a brokerage account for real-time tracking.
- 2. **News Aggregation:** Jaid scans thousands of financial news sources daily, identifying and filtering relevant news while discarding articles with little or no impact.
- 3. **Sentiment Analysis:** Using deep learning, Jaid classifies articles as positive, negative, or neutral and measures sentiment strength and historical impact.
- 4. **Personalized Newsletter & Alerts:** Users receive a customized newsletter with ranked news and sentiment scores, with options for real-time alerts and adjustable delivery frequency. See Exhibits 1 and 2 for a process flow of how Jaid works and its agentic workflow.

## 4. What sources does Jaid use to gather financial news, and how does it determine what is important?

Jaid aggregates news from a variety of **trusted financial sources**, including major financial news websites, regulatory filings, earnings reports, analyst insights, and official company press releases. It continuously scans thousands of articles daily and filters them based on **credibility**, **relevance**, and **market impact**. Jaid's **importance engine** scores each article by analyzing:

- Source credibility: Prioritizing reputable financial outlets and analysts.
- **Relevance to portfolio holdings:** Filtering out general market news unless it has a direct impact.
- **Historical impact of similar news:** Identifying how past news of the same type influenced markets.
- **Sentiment strength:** Evaluating positive or negative sentiment in an article and its possible effect on a company.

#### Bias, Reliability & Competitive Positioning

#### 5. How does Jaid account for bias in financial news?

Bias in financial reporting is a known issue, as different publications may frame the same event in varying ways. Jaid addresses this by **aggregating multiple sources**, reducing reliance on any single viewpoint. The **AI-driven sentiment model focuses on tone, wording, and key financial phrases** rather than subjective human interpretation. Users can also **customize their preferred sources** in future premium versions, filtering or excluding certain publishers for more control over their news feed.

## 6. How is Jaid different from competitors like Atom, Kavout, Aiera, Seeking Alpha, and traditional news aggregators?

Unlike competitors, Jaid is **not just another news aggregator** or investment forum. Atom, Kavout, and Aiera focus on **stock screening and AI-driven investment recommendations**, while Seeking Alpha offers **crowdsourced research** that requires manual review. Some free tools, like **The Wall Street Journal's "10 Point" Daily Newsletter**, provide broad financial updates but lack **personalization to a user's holdings**. Jaid **curates news specifically for each user's portfolio** and provides **granular sentiment scoring**, making it more actionable than generalized market news. #### 7. Why can't I ask ChatGPT to do this and get it for free?

While ChatGPT is a powerful AI tool for answering general financial questions, it lacks portfolio-specific news filtering, real-time market tracking, and AI-driven sentiment scoring tailored to an investor's specific holdings. Jaid continuously scans financial news, prioritizes what's relevant to your portfolio, and provides curated insights—something ChatGPT does not do natively.

Additionally, ChatGPT doesn't track historical sentiment trends, provide custom alerts, or analyze sector-wide shifts in real time. Jaid is designed to streamline investment research and decision-making by delivering concise, personalized insights straight to your inbox. While ChatGPT can answer broad financial questions, Jaid provides actionable, real-time intelligence specific to your investments. See Exhibit 5a to view a sample ChatGPT output when asked to perform similar functions as Jaid. See Exhibit 5b for analysis of this output. We observed that ChatGPT (even with fine-tuned instructions) consistently underperformed Jaid due to pulling from unreliable sources, using old articles, duplicating articles, missing important events, and giving nonsensical sentiment scores.

#### **Market Coverage & Customization**

#### 8. Does Jaid support international markets?

Yes, Jaid supports all major global stock exchanges and provides international financial news coverage. While it currently focuses on U.S. markets, it also tracks European, Asian, and emerging market financial news. Future updates will include expanded sentiment analysis for non-U.S. securities.

#### 9. What types of assets does Jaid track?

Jaid currently supports **stocks**. Future updates will expand coverage to include **bonds**, **cryptocurrencies**, and **commodities such as gold**, **silver**, **oil**, **and agricultural products**, allowing users to track sentiment across multiple asset classes.

#### 10. Can I adjust how often I receive updates from Jaid?

Yes, users can customize their news frequency, delivery times, and sentiment-based alert thresholds. Options include daily digests, real-time notifications, or weekly summaries,

depending on individual preferences. This feature will only be available with a premium subscription.

#### **Performance & Validation**

#### 11. How has Jaid been validated?

Jaid has undergone **beta testing with early adopters**. Testing so far has demonstrated that Jaid **significantly reduces the time spent searching for relevant news** while maintaining high precision in story selection. Jaid is undergoing continuous validation with its beta testing group. See Exhibits 6a, 6b, 6c, and 6d for examples of what deciphering investor news looks like with and without Jaid's features.

#### 12. Will Jaid integrate with brokerage accounts?

Yes, in the near future **premium users** will be able to connect their brokerage accounts, enabling Jaid to **track holdings in real time** and send **instant alerts** on relevant news events.

#### 13. Does Jaid provide financial advice?

No, Jaid is an **investment research tool**, not a financial advisory service. It does **not provide buy or sell recommendations, trade signals, or portfolio management services**. Investors should use Jaid as a **supplement to their own research** and consult a financial advisor for personalized decisions.

#### **Advanced Features & Future Upgrades**

#### 14. Will Jaid support sentiment analysis for cryptocurrencies and DeFi assets?

This feature is coming soon. In future updates Jaid will expand its capabilities to include cryptocurrency sentiment tracking for DeFi assets, blockchain news, and regulatory changes affecting digital currencies.

#### 15. Can Jaid detect and track industry trends?

Yes, Jaid identifies **sector-wide trends** by analyzing sentiment across multiple companies within an industry. This helps investors anticipate **broader market movements**, regulatory shifts, and economic changes affecting an entire sector. However, Jaid only flags these to users if an article about sector-wide trends is relevant to an investor's portfolio.

#### 16. Will Jaid include historical sentiment tracking?

Yes, premium users will be able to access **historical sentiment trends** for stocks, sectors, and asset classes, allowing them to analyze **how past sentiment shifts correlated with price movements**.

#### 17. What if Jaid gets a sentiment score wrong or different sources have conflicting views?

Jaid continuously refines its sentiment model using market reaction data. When news sentiment is mixed across sources, Jaid assigns a confidence rating and provides the full range of sentiment scores. Users can also view the original articles to verify interpretations themselves. In cases of highly volatile news events, Jaid will flag sentiment scores as "low confidence" and provide a disclaimer encouraging further research.

#### 18. Can Jaid be used by financial advisors?

Yes, while Jaid is built for retail investors, **financial advisors** can use it to track **client holdings** and stay updated on relevant market-moving news. Future premium versions may include **multi-portfolio tracking** for advisors managing multiple clients.

#### 19. What future developments are planned for Jaid?

Jaid has an ambitious roadmap aimed at expanding its capabilities to provide even more value to investors. One of the most anticipated features is **brokerage account integration**, allowing users to seamlessly connect their investment accounts and receive real-time sentiment-driven insights on their holdings. Additionally, **historical sentiment tracking** will be introduced, enabling investors to analyze past sentiment trends and their correlation with stock price movements over time

Another key upgrade is **deep research functionality**, which will offer in-depth AI-driven insights into specific stocks, sectors, and investment themes—available exclusively to premium users. **Social media sentiment tracking** is also in development, providing investors with a way to monitor retail investor sentiment from platforms like Twitter and Reddit, complementing traditional financial news sources.

Jaid will also expand its **asset coverage** by adding **commodities sentiment tracking**, making it possible to assess AI-driven sentiment trends for gold, oil, agricultural products, and other key market-moving resources. Enhancements to **international market sentiment analysis** will further improve coverage for investors with global portfolios.

To improve user experience, Jaid will introduce **greater customization options**, allowing investors to set more granular news frequency controls, custom sentiment alert thresholds, and source filtering capabilities. Together, these developments will position Jaid as the most comprehensive AI-powered investment news and sentiment analysis tool on the market.

#### 20. How does Jaid handle breaking news and major global events?

Jaid monitors financial news in real time and sends immediate alerts for major economic events, central bank decisions, geopolitical developments, and policy changes that could cause major impacts to an investor's portfolio.

#### 21. How does Jaid evaluate news sources for reliability?


Jaid prioritizes established financial outlets, regulatory filings, and credible investment research, while deprioritizing speculative blogs or low-accuracy sources.




**Exhibit 1: Jaid Process Flow Diagram** 




**Exhibit 2: Jaid Agentic Workflow**


